Cultural Affairs Commission members are appointed by the County Executive: 10 citizens serving 3-year terms and 3 County Board Supervisors serving 2-year terms.

Members will oversee the provision of county services and the allocation of county money to cultural programs, encouraging the maximum service and accountability in return for tax dollars.






DANE ARTS MURAL ARTS | DAMA

DAMA is a mural project within Dane Arts whose purpose is to engage community members throughout Dane County in the mural making process. Together, we are creating art for public display of the highest merit. Knowing that our impact will extend beyond those who actively participate in the creation of murals, DAMA recruits participants through multi-channeled community networks and positively affects the quality of life for Dane County residents. Our work builds upon dozens of existing collaborations – while continually creating new ones – both local and national.

Through DAMA, community artists are trained in the process of creating community murals. They use art as an educational tool to make a difference in the lives of Dane County communities with an emphasis on working with at-risk youth. DAMA engages communities and youth in all aspects of mural making – providing opportunities to experience success through organized, hands-on, hard work. Our goal is to address disparities by working within urban and rural communities that have limitations to arts programs. - → Communities are experiencing an enhanced sense of place and community connectedness.

DAMA is dedicated to utilizing the transformative power of art to visually beautify communities and engage members of neighborhoods in the process. DAMA artists benefit from the increased opportunity for paid work as community artists. Youth benefit by working alongside skilled trained artists who understand that deliberate practice leads to success. Other community participants benefit from the ownership of the public art in which they are fully a part. Through their hard work, youth benefit from the artist mentor relationships created, and earn direct job skills.


